The pay is around \$15 per hour and they will accept part-time workers this year. The big issue of our meeting was "Special Events Permits." This is where "Island Time" wants to perform on our lake, but they must have a permit through the Sheriff's Office and that notifies watercraft inspectors to be present at the event. AIS is easily spread with incoming watercraft to these events-especially pontoons with hydraulic lifts.

Starry Stonewort is becoming all the scare of our lake associations. We would like decontamination stations at our accesses, but it's a cost item.
